POPULATION

Initial Phase of Statewide Initiative

January 2010 – January 2011

- Multi system (child welfare, juvenile justice, OYA, DD, Special Ed – 504s, Alternate Ed, health, A/D, mental health (3 systems), public, private or no insurance
- Complex behavioral health needs – CASII 4, 5, 6; ITS, JCP (Juvenile Justice); Risk Needs Assessment (OYA); ASAM.
- Low risk to re-offend and high risk mental health (OYA).
- Exclusions – DD in group homes 24 hour residential with no plan to return to family setting and high risk OYA/JCP.
- In or at risk of high level placement such as residential care, hospital, sub acute, detention, OYA
- School-age population

PROPOSED SHARED SERVICE OUTCOMES

Data collected and recorded by care coordinators (facilitators)

1. Reduction in cost of care.
2. Significant reduction in recidivism rates for juvenile arrests.
3. Reduction in referrals for felonies and misdemeanors.
4. Increased student attendance in school.
5. Increased permanency (family, adoption, long-term foster care, emancipation, etc.).
6. Fewer transitions (foster placements, hospitalizations, residential care, detention, corrections, school, etc.).
7. Reduction of in-school and out-of-school suspensions.

PROPOSED SHARED SERVICE OUTCOMES

To be monitored by using the Community Supports for Wraparound Inventory (CSWI) and the Wraparound Fidelity Index (WFI).

- Integrity/fidelity of the wraparound process.
- Team progress on the individualized goals included on the wraparound plan.
