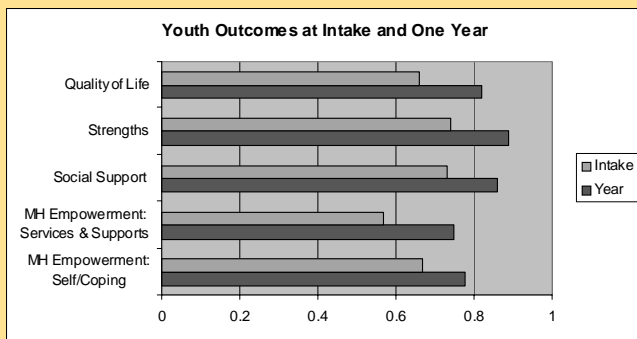


OREGON WRAPAROUND

Outcomes for the highest risk youth



Wraparound Oregon - Multnomah County - 2008

From most costly care to the community

- ✓ 73% of children previously in day treatment integrated back into the public school system.
- ✓ Average length of stay in residential care reduced from 7.5 months to 2 months.

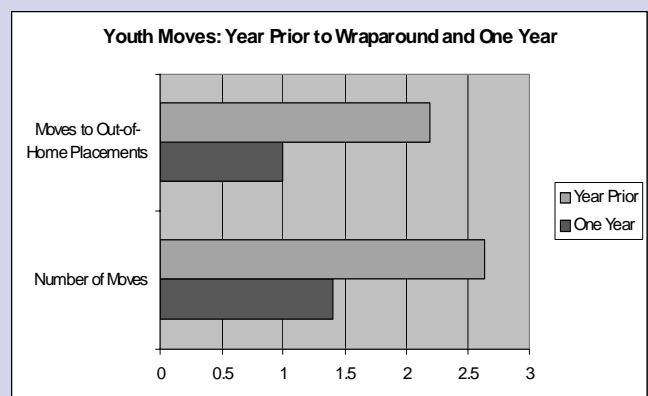
Out of Trouble

Improved school functioning

- ✓ Decreased suspensions by 16% and expulsions by 18%.
- ✓ Improved school attendance by 51.4%.
- ✓ Improved or stabilized academic performance by 74%.

Using existing resources to improve outcomes for Oregon's kids

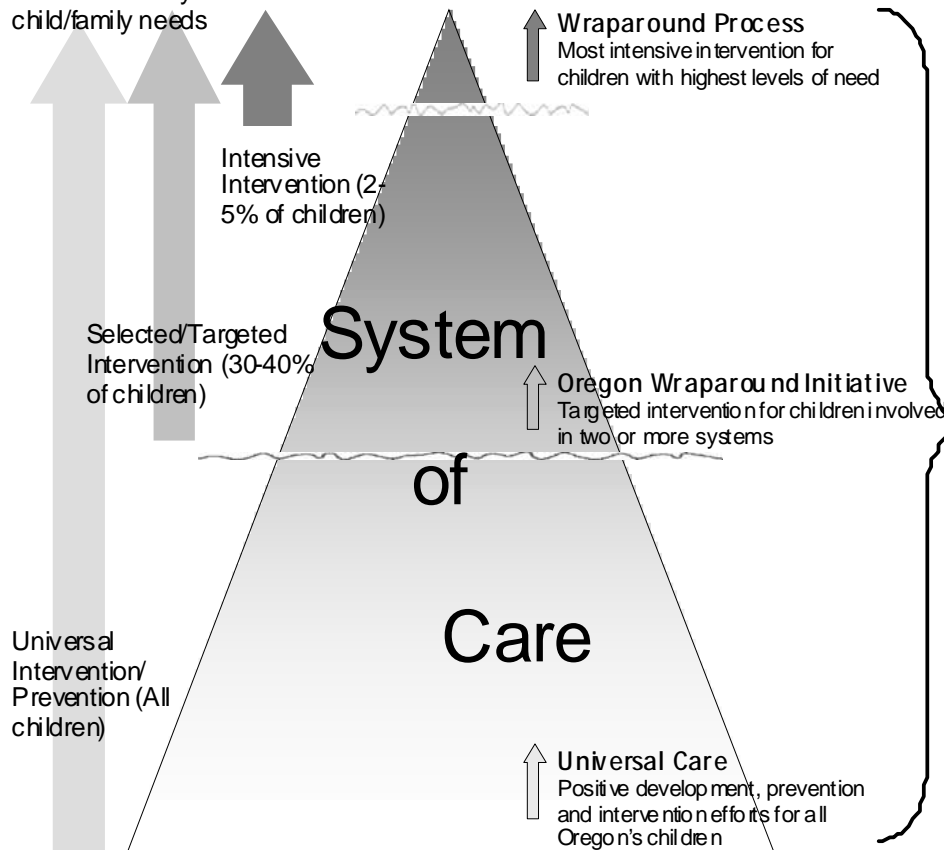
A SHORT SUCCESS STORY

Jessie came to Wraparound Oregon - Multnomah County two years ago at the age of 15. She was gang involved and on the run from foster care. Jessie was involved in a serious juvenile offense and was on her way to detention when we connected with her. She had no high school credits. Her whole high school career had been chaotic due to multiple placements and homelessness. Jessie was initially reluctant to get involved because of her past negative experience with service systems. She liked Wraparound Oregon because folks actually listened to her. Very quickly she was reunited with her grandmother, who joined her child and family team.

Jessie's creative plan included: arranging for her grandmother, who lived in Washington, to travel to Portland; helping Jessie to attend her mother's memorial service with her sister (mom recently died in an auto accident); and encouraging Jessie to express her feelings through poetry. As people listened, she was less resistant and more engaged in treatment. She returned to school and found a more stable foster home with increased natural supports. Jessie completed a 30 day residential alcohol and drug program, is in recovery, and out of the gang lifestyle. Jessie dreams of going to college and becoming a probation officer.

consistent values guide *all* activities and decisions at the system level AND at the service level:

- Cultural Competence
- Family & Youth Voice
- Strengths Based
- "Seamless"
- Collaborative, Coordinated
- Unconditional Care
- Prevention/Early Intervention
- Effective Services
- Natural Supports

The Oregon Statewide Wraparound Initiative combines a *public health approach* with a *system of care philosophy* in order to meet the needs of children involved in two or more systems, and their families.
